



## Camper Only Campout June 23, 2017 Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What if my child becomes homesick?

We want campouts to be a fun and pleasant experience for everyone. If any campers become too homesick, we will call the parents to come and pick them up.

### 2. What if my child needs to take medicine while at the campout?

Please let Kimery in the camp office know if your child needs to take any medication. Also be sure you have completed a medication card.

### 3. May I visit my child at the campout?

We strongly discourage parents from stopping by on campout nights. Past experience shows that it is often when a parent drops in that we start to see the first signs of homesickness occur. It is also sometimes difficult for other campers who start to wonder why their moms and dads didn't come by. We will have a family campout later in July for moms and dads. Rest assured, we will definitely call you if we have any problems, but please don't stop by the campout.

### 4. My child is in Discovery Camp (ages 3-6) -- How do they do at the campout?

Believe it or not - ages 3-6 generally do just as well as our older campers at the campouts. In the past years we have had multiple three-year-olds to stay at a campout at one time with absolutely no problems.

### 5. What if it rains on campout night - do you cancel?

Camper Campouts are held rain or shine and in the event of rain, we just move the fun indoors for games and activities. It takes more than some H2O to stop a Tate's Day Camp Campout. (This policy is different for our Family Campout.)
